Background to Publishing

- Facilitates the spread of creativity, news and ideas
- Traditionally associated with book production but has evolved with technological progress
- Today's publishers are complex organisations that create content across various platforms



Copyright

- Cross-industry agreement on importance of copyright.
- Copyright exceptions and licensing
- Weaking copyright = fewer works to enjoy



Threats to Copyright

New Text and Data Mining Exception

- TDM researchers copy copyrighted material
- Government want to improve international competitiveness
- New exception would damage UK's copyright framework.

IP Exhaustion

- IP exhaustion limits IP owner's geographical control
- UK looking to change to international exhaustion regime
- Change would damage UK publishing and increase 'parallel imports'



Piracy and Enforcement



- Publishing and piracy
- Disruption and enforcement options for publishers
 - Takedown notices
 - Legal action
 - Referral to the Police Intellectual Property Crime Unit
 - Website Blocking





Open Access

- Importance of scientific publishing
- Open Access = change from subscription model to publishers providing free online access.

Freedom of Speech

- Freedom of speech allows publishing to flourish
- SLAPP = Strategic Lawsuit Against Public Participation
